#### No 1. EASTER

Rise heart; thy Lord is Risen. Sing his praise

Without delays,

Who takes thee by the hand, that thou likewise



## MUSICAL NOTES:

This morning's service features sacred music from mainly British composers of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century. The *Five Mystical Songs* of Ralph Vaughan Williams, the most substantial musical part of the service will feature baritone, Trevor Scheunemann, who enjoys an international operatic career, including performances in leading roles with such houses as: The Metropolitan Opera, Washington National Opera, Opera de Monte Carlo, and San Francisco Opera among many others. Mr. Scheunemann is a graduate of Washington Adventist University, Takoma Park, and a distinguished alumnus of the world-renowned Domingo-Cafritz Artist Program at Washington National Opera.

The *Five Mystical Songs* were written for baritone solo, choir and orchestra, however, this performance features the composer's orchestral reduction for string quintet and piano. The words are taken from four poems ("Easter" divided into two parts) by George Herbert (1593 - 1633), a metaphysical Welsh poet, orator and priest of the Church of England; and were selected by Vaughan Williams from the poet's 1633 collection, *The Temple: Sacred Poems*. Other musical presentations include *O Clap Your Hands*, a text taken from Psalm 47, by Ralph Vaughan Williams and *Gloria in excelsis "Coronation"* by Charles Villiers Stanford, composed for the coronation of George V, in Westminster Abbey, on June 22, 1911. Both anthems will be accompanied by a brass septet.

The Choral Benediction, *The Lord Bless You and Keep You* is by the contemporary British composer, John Rutter, composed for the memorial service of his teacher and mentor, Edward Chapman, in 1981. The text is taken from the book of Numbers, which recounts the fact that God dictated these words to Moses, as the prescribed form of words, to be used by the high priest, Aaron, and other members of the priestly order, when imparting God's blessing to his people at the close of their morning services. The festive nature of the service concludes with a performance of the jubilant *Toccata* from the Symphony No. 5., by the French composer, Charles-Marie Widor. Composed in 1879, this much loved organ work is probably the composer's most celebrated composition, often used to accompany moments of high celebration.

It was made world famous as being the recessional for the wedding of Princess Margaret to Antony Armstrong Jones in Westminster Abbey, in May, 1960. This morning's performance adds the forces of the brass septet to the church's newly restored organ.

The church wishes to thank all those who have joined their musical talents together to make this service a true Post-Easter festival of thanks and praise to our risen Saviour our Lord Jesus Christ. To him, who sits upon the throne, be the blessing, honor, and glory and dominion, now and forever more. Amen!
